STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Trustees of the Bangor Masonic Fraternity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Jeremiah Fenno, Geo. W. Whit-

- 2 ney, Charles I. Collamore, John H. Lynde, Edward
- 3 F. Dillingham, Wm. W. Doane, David Bugbee, Isaac
- 4 W. Currier, Job Collett, Lemuel Bradford, Hiram H.
- 5 Fogg, and Nathan P. Kellogg, their associates and
- 6 successors, are hereby created a corporation by the
- 7 name of the Trustees of the Bangor Masonic Fraternity,
- 8 for the purpose of holding in trust, and managing any
- 9 funds and property, real or personal, belonging to the
- 10 several masonic organizations in Bangor, with all th

- 11 rights, and subject to the liabilities prescribed for
- 12 similar corporations by the general laws of the state.
 - SECT. 2. For the purpose aforesaid, said corporation
 - 2 may take by purchase, gift, devise, or otherwise, and
 - 3 hold any property or funds as aforesaid to the amount
 - 4 of seventy-five thousand dollars at cost; and the same
 - 5 to manage and control, sell and convey, lease, loan
 - 6 and otherwise dispose of, in the same manner as own-
 - 7 ers have a right to manage and dispose of their own
 - 8 property, but in accordance with the provisions of any
 - 9 by-laws of said corporation then existing.
 - SECT. 3. Said corporation may by its by-laws deter-
 - 2 mine the number of its members, their qualifications,
 - 3 and tenure of office, time and manner of election, and
 - 4 other things pertaining to their government and con-
 - 5 stitution and modes of proceeding, not inconsistent
 - 6 with the laws of the state, which by-laws, so made,
 - 7 shall, for the time being, have all the force and effect
 - 8 of law, as if incorporated in their charter.
 - SECT. 4. John H. Lynde and Jeremiah Fenno, one
 - 2 or both, may call the first meeting for the organiza-
 - 3 tion, by giving each other corporator notice thereof,
 - 4 seven days at least before the time of meeting.
