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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

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AN ACT to amend section fifty-four, item second of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, relating to the branches taught in public schools.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Item second of section fifty-four, chapter 2 eleven of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by 3 inserting after the word "arithmetic" in the fifth 4 line, the word 'physiology,' so that the item, as 5 amended, shall read as follows :

6 Item second. On satisfactory evidence that a can-  
7 didate possesses a good moral character, and a temper  
8 and disposition suitable to be an instructor of youth,  
9 they shall examine him in reading, spelling, writing,  
10 English grammar, geography, history, arithmetic,

11 physiology, and other branches usually taught in pub-  
12 lic schools, and particularly in the school for which he  
13 is examined, and also as to capacity for the govern-  
14 ment thereof.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
