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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

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AN ACT to amend section one hundred and sixteen of chapter six of the revised statutes, relating to the collection of taxes.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section one hundred and sixteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

3    When the owner or possessor of goods, wares and mer-  
4    chandise, logs, timber, boards and other lumber, stock  
5    in trade, including stock employed in the business of  
6    any of the mechanic arts, horses, mules, neat cattle,  
7    sheep or swine, resides in any other town than the one  
8    in which such personal property is kept and taxed, the  
9    constable or collector having a tax on any such prop-  
10   erty for collection, may demand it of any such owner

11 or possessor in any part of the state, and on his refusal  
12 to pay it may distrain him by his goods, and for  
13 want thereof, may commit him to jail in the county  
14 where he is found till he pays it or is discharged by  
15 law.
