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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

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### AN ACT to secure a lien on bricks.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Any person who performs or furnishes  
2 labor or wood for manufacturing and burning bricks,  
3 shall have a lien on such bricks for such labor or wood  
4 to take precedence of all other claims, and to continue  
5 in force for ninety days after the same are burned  
6 suitable for use ; *provided* said bricks remain in the  
7 yard, and to be enforced by attachment within that  
8 time, which shall have precedence of all attachments  
9 and incumbrances not made to secure a similar lien,  
10 and such suit may be maintained, though the employer  
11 or debtor is dead and his estate is rendered insolvent ;  
12 and in that case his executor or administrator may be

13 summoned to answer thereto, and judgment rendered  
14 as in other cases against executors and administrators  
15 and execution issued and enforced to satisfy such lien.

SECT. 2. This act is in force when approved.
