## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT to establish the right to fish in small ponds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The fishery of any pond or lake whose

- 2 area does not exceed one hundred acres, shall be
- 3 private, and shall be vested in the riparian proprie-
- 4 tors, subject to whatever laws the legislature may
- 5 enact; provided, that no proprietor shall avail himself
- 6 of the right conveyed by this section until he shall
- 7 have published notice of his intention so to do five
- 8 weeks successively in some weekly newspaper pub-
- 9 lished in the county in which such pond or lake is situ-
- 10 ated, or if there be no newspaper published in that
- 11 county, then in the state paper.
  - SECT. 2. No person shall take or kill, or use any

- 2 implements for taking or killing, any fish in waters
- 3 whose fisheries are made private by this act, without
- 4 the consent of the proprietor, under a penalty of five
- 5 dollars for each offence, and a further penalty of one
- 6 dollar for each fish so taken.
  - Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
