# STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT to promote immigration into this state.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Whereas, in section three of an act enti-2 tled an act to provide means for the defence of the 3 northeastern frontier, approved March twenty-four, 4 eighteen hundred and sixty-four, it is provided, "that 5 the European and North American Railway Company 6 is charged with the duty of encouraging immigration 7 into the state, and shall be required to appoint a suita-8 ble immigrant agent, and annually publish such plans, 9 statements and other information, as shall give to the 10 public a better knowledge of the extent, value and 11 situation of the public lands of Maine, now open for 12 settlement, and cause this information to be printed in

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13 our own and other languages, and distributed into 14 other states of the union and into foreign lands;" and 15 whereas, it is provided in the same section, that "the 16 legislature of this state shall have the right at all times 17 to inquire into the manner in which these trusts are 18 executed, and to pass any laws that may be necessary 19 to impose fines and penalties to secure a compliance 20 with the provisions, liabilities and duties hereinbefore 21 set forth and enjoined;" and whereas, said railway 22 company have utterly failed to perform the duties 23 therein enjoined, it is hereby declared and made 24 known, that the time may be extended for the per-25 formance of these duties until the first day of July 26 next, and no further.

SECT. 2. It shall be duty of the attorney general of 2 this state to inquire into and ascertain whether the 3 duties set forth in the said act of eighteen hundred and 4 sixty-four and in section one of this act, and at the 5 time as extended in said section one of this act, have 6 been performed; and if at that time the said company 7 shall have failed to perform these duties, they shall be 8 fined not less than five thousand dollars, and the same 9 sum yearly thereafter, to be recovered in the same 10 manner as an action for debt against said company; 11 and it shall be the duty of the attorney general to

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12 make immediate demand of said company for the fine 13 or fines thus imposed, and in case the said company 14 shall neglect or refuse to pay the fines thus demanded 15 within ten days after such demand, it shall then be 16 the duty of the attorney general to sue said company 17 in the name of the state, and collect the fine or fines 18 as soon as due process of law will allow; and all 19 moneys so collected shall be expended under direction 20 of the commission of immigration to promote immigra-21 tion into this state.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
