STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter seventy-seven of the revised statutes, relative to the equity jurisdiction of the supreme judicial court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The ninth specification of section five, chapter seventy-seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended, by striking out the word "or" in the first line thereof, and by inserting after the word "districts" in the first line of said specification, the words, 'village corporations, or other public corporations by whatever name,' so that said specification as amended shall read as follows :

9 *Ninth*—When counties, cities, towns, school districts,
10 village corporations, or other public corporations by

11 whatever name, for a purpose not authorized by law,
12 vote to pledge their credit or to raise money by taxa-
13 tion, or to pay money from their treasury ; or for such
14 purpose, any of their officers or agents attempt to pay
15 out such money, the court shall have equity jurisdic-
16 tion, on application of not less than ten taxable inhab-
17 itants therein.
