## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. In order to provide for several acts and
- 2 resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of
- 3 money from the treasury, and also to provide for the
- 4 necessary expenditures of government for the current
- 5 fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated
- 6 out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor,
- 7 with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby
- 8 authorized at any time prior to the first day of January
- 9 next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the
- 10 same.
