STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to incorporate the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Sidney Perham, Samuel F. Hersey,

Perry, 15 Alden Chase, and their associate subscribers, be and 16 are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by 17 the name of the Maine Industrial School for Girls, and 18 by that title shall have perpetual succession, and may 19 sue and be sued, may plead and be impleaded in the 20 courts of this state and elsewhere; may have, use or 21 change a common seal; may receive, hold or convey 22 any estate, real or personal, that may come into their 23 possession, and which property, together with the 24 funds granted to or held by said corporation for the 25 purposes herein named, shall, with the income thereof, 26 be exempted from taxation; may act as a guardian to 27 the person of any girl who, between the ages of seven 28 and fifteen years, shall be committed to its charge ac-29 cording to law, for the physical, mental and moral 30 training of such girl, which guardianship of such girl 31 shall supersede any other guardianship of parents or 32 guardians during the time that such girl is under the 33 charge of this corporation, and no longer; and may 34 make such by-laws and appoint such officers and agents 35 as shall be specified in such by-laws, or, as may be 36 necessary to carry out the purposes of the corporation; 37 but it is hereby provided on the part of the state, that

- 38 the governor, secretary of state and superintendent of
- 39 common schools, shall be ex-officio of the principal
- 40 officers of the corporation.
 - Sect. 2. The said corporators shall meet for the
 - 2 first time at the call of five of the corporators herein
 - 3 named, to organize this corporation, adopt by-laws
 - 4 and transact such other business as shall be necessary
 - 5 and proper.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall be of effect on and after its
 - 2 approval.
