# STATEMENT OF FACTS IN REGARD TO ELLIOT ACADEMY.

Situated in Elliot, in the county of York. Built in 1839. In 1860 received a small amount of aid from the State. It is the high school for the towns of York, Kittery and Elliot; has been able, by the help of these towns, to keep two or three terms a year, and by having some assistance from the State, the Institution will be able to keep four terms, and make the school what it should be in that location.

#### STATE OF MAINE.

#### RESOLVE in favor of Elliot Academy.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars is 2 hereby annually appropriated, out of any money in the 3 treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the term of 4 five years, to Elliot Academy, an institution of learn-5 ing located in the town of Elliot, in the county of 6 York; provided however, that this appropriation is 7 made on the express condition that the trustees of 8 said academy shall maintain and keep in operation 9 a school, equal in rank and grade of teaching with 10 a first class academy; and also maintain a normal 11 department, equal in grade to that required by law 12 of the state normal schools; and provided further, 13 that the governor and council, and superintendent of 14 common schools shall have a right at any and all 15 times, to visit said school, when the same shall be in 16 operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and 17 council, said academy at any time hereafter shall fail 18 to fulfil the conditions contained in this resolve, they 19 may in their discretion withhold the appropriation 20 herein granted.
