STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT creating a lien on animals to secure payment for pasturing, feeding and sheltering.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Any person who pastures, feeds or shelters animals by virtue of a contract with, or by consent of the owner, shall have a lien thereon for the amount due for such pasturing, feeding or sheltering, to secure payment thereof with costs, to be enforced by attachment in courts of competent jurisdiction, in the same manner as lien on goods and personal baggage by innholders or keepers of boarding-houses.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
