## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT relating to recognizances, creating a lien upon the real estate of principal and sureties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Entering into a recognizance for the appearance of 2 an accused person in a criminal case shall create a 3 lien on any real estate the principal and sureties, or any 4 of them, may have, but such lien shall not be valid 5 unless within five days after such recognizance is 6 taken the magistrate before whom, or the clerk or 7 recorder of the court before which, the recognizance 8 is taken shall file in the office of the registry of deeds 9 a certificate setting forth the names of the parties to 10 the recognizance, the amount and date; and a record 11 thereof shall be made in the book of attachments.
