STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT additional to chapter one hundred and thirteen of revised statutes, relating to poor debtors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Whenever a debtor has cited or given
- 2 notice as provided in said chapter one hundred and
- 3 thirteen, to make a disclosure of his affairs, and have-
- 4 the benefit of the oath in said chapter one hundred and
- 5 thirteen, and fails to appear and select a justice, and
- 6 make his disclosure according to the provisions of said
- 7 chapter one hundred and thirteen, the attested copy of
- 8 said citation or notice shall be sufficient to give juris-
- 9 diction to the justice of the peace and of the quorum,
- 10 selected by the creditor, his agent or attorney, to so
- 11 far act as to give judgment and render an execution

- 12 running against the goods and estate, and body of the
- 13 debtor, for all expenses incurred by the creditor, as
- 14 travel and attendance of the creditor or his attorney,
- 15 and for fees of witnesses, both to be taxed as in cases
- 16 before the supreme judicial court, and also for the
- 17 travel and fees of the justice himself; and said debtor
- 18 shall not be permitted to disclose upon any subsequent
- 19 citation or notice, or derive any benefit from the pro-
- 20 visions of said one hundred and thirteenth chapter until
- 21 any execution thus rendered, shall be fully satisfied.
 - Sect. 2. All citations or notices to creditors, pro-
 - 2 vided for in said chapter, shall be served by an attested
 - 3 copy, unless waived by the creditor.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
