STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT prohibiting the manufacture or sale of prize candy, prize stationery, and other merchandize.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall sell, or offer for 2 sale, in this state, any prize candy, in packages con-3 taining or purporting to contain any money, article, 4 or other thing as a prize or gift, shall, upon convic-5 tion thereof before any trial justice, or court of com-6 petent jurisdiction, for each offence be punished by 7 imprisment in any jail or house of correction for a term 8 not exceeding thirty days, or by a fine not exceeding 9 twenty dollars.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall be discovered in the 2 commission of any offence specified in the preceding

3 section, in any railroad car, steamboat, public convey-4 ance, or other place, by any sheriff or other officer 5 qualified to serve criminal process, may be arrested by 6 such officer and lawfully detained by imprisonment or 7 otherwise not exceeding twenty-four hours, until a 8 complaint shall be made against him for such offence 9 and a warrant issued thereon.
