STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter eighty-nine of the revised statutes, relating to reviews.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section five of chapter eighty-nine is
- 2 amended by adding after the word "vacation" in the
- 3 second line, the words, 'order notice thereon, and
- 4 may,' and adding after "judgment" in the last line,
- 5 'service thereon shall be by summons and copy four-
- 6 teen days before it is returnable, and all orders of
- 7 notice heretofore made by any justice of said court in
- 8 vacation, are hereby confirmed and made valid, so
- 9 that said section shall read as follows:
- 10 "On presentation of a petition for review, any
- 11 justice of court, may in term time or vacation, order

12 notice thereon, and may stay execution on the judg13 ment complained of, or grant a supersedeas, upon a
14 bond filed, with sureties approved by him, or by such
15 person as he appoints, in double the amount of the
16 damages and costs conditional to pay said amount if the
17 petition is denied, or the amount of the final judgment
18 on review, if it is granted, with interest thereon at the
19 rate of twelve per cent. from the date of the bond to
20 the time of judgment. Service thereon shall be by
21 summons and copy fourteen days before it is return22 able, and all orders of notice heretofore made by any
23 justice of said court in vacation are hereby confirmed
24 and made valid."

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
