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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

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AN ACT to amend chapter seventy-seven, section sixteen, of the revised statutes, relating to the day of the rendition of judgments in certain cases.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The words “and stating the day of its reception, 2 which shall be deemed the day of the rendition of 3 judgment,” are hereby stricken from section sixteen 4 of chapter seventy-seven of the revised statutes, so 5 that said section shall read as follows :

6 *Sect. 16.* The clerk of any county, by virtue of a 7 certificate provided for in section fourteen received in 8 vacation, shall enter judgment as of the preceding 9 term, and execution may issue as of that term ; but 10 all attachments then in force shall continue thirty

11 days after the next term in that county; and if the  
12 defendant was arrested on mesne process and gave  
13 bond to disclose after judgment, he may do so after  
14 said next term without breach of his bond.
