STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE providing for an amendment of the constitution so as to authorize the legislature to call a constitutional convention.

Resolved, Two-thirds of both houses concurring and 2 deeming it necessary, that the following be proposed 3 as an amendment to the constitution of this state, 4 which when approved and adopted in the manner pro-5 vided by the constitution, shall become a part thereof 6 viz: Section four of article ten, shall be amended, by 7 adding thereto the following words: "and the legis-8 lature by a two-thirds vote of both branches, may call 9 a convention to revise and amend this constitution, and 10 provide by law for the election of delegates to the 11 same; but no such revision or amendment shall take 12 effect until the same shall have been submitted to the 13 electors of the state and adopted by a majority of those 14 voting thereon."

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities and selectmen 2 of the several towns and the assessors of plantations 3 in this state, be and they are hereby directed to notify 4 the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and 5 plantations, in the manner prescribed by law, to give 6 in their votes at the annual meeting in September 7 next, upon the amendment proposed in the foregoing 8 resolve; and the question shall be, Shall the constitu-9 tion be amended as proposed by resolve of the legisla-10 ture providing that the legislature may call a conven-11 tion to revise and amend the constitution? and the 12 inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations, shall 13 vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of said 14 amendment expressing it by the word "yes" upon 15 their ballots, and those opposed to the amendment, 16 expressing it by the word "no" upon their ballots; 17 and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted, de-18 clared and recorded in open ward, town and planta-19 tion meetings, and fair copies of the lists shall be made 20 by the aldermen, selectmen, assessors and clerks of the 21 several cities, towns and plantations, in the same man-22 ner as votes for senators, and shall be returned to the 23 office of the secretary of state within twenty days after The governor and council, after the 24 said election. 25 expiration of said twenty days, shall forthwith exam-26 ine and count the same, and if it shall appear that a

- 27 majority of the electors voting on the question, are in
- 28 favor of such amendment, it shall become a part of the
- 29 constitution; and the governor shall thereupon issue
- 30 his proclamation making known the fact, and shall
- 31 cause the same to be published three weeks succes-
- 32 sively in the Kennebec Journal.

Resolved, That the polls shall be opened and closed

- 2 in all the cities, towns and plantations in the state, on
- 3 the second Monday of September next, at the usual
- 4 hours prescribed by law in the election of state and
- 5 county officers.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall forward

- 2 to the several cities, towns and plantations a sufficient
- 3 number of properly prepared votes and blank returns,
- 4 in conformity with the foregoing resolves, accompanied
- 5 with a copy thereof.
