STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to amend section thirty-eight of chapter forty of the revised statutes, relating to the yearly close-time on land-locked salmon, trout and togue.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That section thirty-eight of chapter forty of the re-

- 2 vised statutes be amended, by striking out the words,
- 3 "and January," in the third line of section thirty-
- 4 eight, and insert the word "and," after the word
- 5 November in the second line of said section, so the
- 6 section shall read as follows:
- 7 There shall be a yearly close-time of land-locked
- 8 salmon, trout and togue, during the months of Octo-
- 9 ber, November and December, during which, none of
- 10 the fish mentioned above shall be taken or killed in

11 any manner, under a penalty of not more than thirty
12 nor less than ten dollars, and a further fine of one
13 dollar for each fish so taken or killed; but this section
14 shall not apply to the taking of blueback trout in
15 Franklin and Oxford counties, nor to any person
16 taking fish on his own premises for the purpose of
17 cultivation.
