STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to authorize the Portland, Saco and Portsmouth Railroad Company, to construct a railroad from Kittery to Biddeford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The Portland, Saco and Portsmouth

- 2 Railroad Company is hereby authorized to locate, con-
- 3 struct, maintain and operate a railroad, from some
- 4 convenient point on its present line in the town of
- 5 Kittery, through the towns of Kittery, York, Wells,
- 6 Kennebunk and Kennebunkport, to some convenient
- 7 point on its present line in the city of Biddeford, in
- 8 the county of York, or to such point in said town of
- 9 Kennebunkport, with the right to extend branches
- 10 eastward towards the ocean; with all the rights,
- 11 powers, privileges and immunities of similar railroad

- 12 corporations under the laws of this state, and subject
- 13 to like liabilities. Provided however, that nothing in
- 14 this act shall authorize said company to discontinue or
- 15 cease from operating their road from Kittery to Bidde-
- 16 ford over the present line of its railroad.
 - Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized to increase
 - 2 its capital stock by a sum not exceeding fifteen hun-
 - 3 dred thousand dollars, over and above the amount of
 - 4 its capital heretofore authorized, and to divide the
 - 5 same into shares, and issue stock for such amount as
 - 6 shall be found necessary for the purposes aforesaid.
 - SECT. 3. It shall be the duty of said corporation to
 - 2 make a survey of its main line of road within two
 - 3 years and to construct the same within four years;
 - 4 and if it shall fail so to do, this act shall be void,
 - 5 otherwise it shall remain in full force.
 - SECT. 4. This act shall take effect on its approval.
