STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES providing for an amendment of the constitution, relating to the raising of money for the support of common schools.

Resolved, Two thirds of both branches of the legisla-

- 2 ture concurring, that the constitution of this state shall
- 3 be amended as follows, to wit:
- 4 Article eight, lines four and five, strike out the
- 5 words, "the several towns to make suitable provision
- 6 at their own expense," and insert in place thereof the
- 7 words, "annually to levy and assess a state tax upon
- 8 the valuation of the whole state, as established by the
- 9 laws thereof," so that the article as amended will
- 10 read as follows:

11 ARTICLE VIII.

- 12 A general diffusion of the advantages of education
- 13 being essential to the preservation of the rights and
- 14 liberties of the people, to promote this important

15 object, the legislature are hereby authorized and it 16 shall be their duty annually, to levy and assess a state 17 tax upon the valuation of the whole state as estab-18 lished by the laws thereof, for the support and main-19 tenance of public schools; and it shall further be their 20 duty to encourage and suitably endow from time to 21 time, as the circumstances of the people may author-22 ize, all academies, colleges and seminaries of learning 23 within the state; provided that no donation, grant or 24 endowment shall at any time be made by the legisla-25 ture to any literary institution now established or 26 which may hereafter be established, unless at the time 27 of making such endowment, the legislature of the state 28 shall have a right to grant any further powers to alter, 29 limit or restrain any of the powers vested in any such 30 literary institution, as shall be judged necessary to 31 promote the best interests thereof.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, and the select2 men of the several towns, and the assessors of the
3 several plantations in the state, are hereby empowered
4 and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respec5 tive cities, towns and plantations, in the manner pre6 scribed by law at the annual meeting in September
7 next, to give in their votes upon the amendment pro8 posed in the foregoing resolve; and the question shall
9 be, shall the constitution be amended as proposed by

10 a resolve of the legislature, providing for an amend-11 ment of the constitution, providing that the legislature 12 shall annually levy and assess a state tax upon the 13 whole state valuation as established by the laws there-14 of for the support and maintenance of public schools? 15 and the inhabitants of said cities, towns and planta-16 tions shall vote by ballot on said question, as provided 17 in the foregoing resolve, those in favor of said amend-18 ment respectively expressing it by the word "YES" 19 upon their ballot, and those opposed to the amendment 20 respectively expressing it by the word "NO" upon 21 their ballot; and the ballots shall be received, sorted, 22 counted and declared in open ward, town and planta-23 tion meeting, and lists shall be made out of the votes 24 by the aldermen, selectmen and assessors and clerks 25 of the several cities, towns and plantations, and re-26 turned to the office of the secretary of state, in the 27 same manner as votes for senators, and the governor 28 and council shall count the same, and make return 29 thereof to the next legislature, and if a majority of the 30 votes are in favor of said amendment, the constitution 31 shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare 2 and furnish the several cities, towns and plantations, 3 blank returns, in conformity to the foregoing resolves, 4 accompanied with a copy thereof.
