STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO.

AN ACT to secure a lien on brick.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who performs or furnishes 2 labor or wood for manufacturing and burning bricks, 3 shall have a lien on such bricks for such labor and wood, 4 to take precedence of all other claims, and to continue 5 in force thirty days after the same are burned suitable 6 for use, *provided* said bricks remain in the yard 7 where burnt, and to be enforced by attachment within 8 that time, which shall have precedence of all attach-9 ments and incumbrances not made to secure a similar 10 lien, and such suit may be maintained though the em-11 ployer or debtor is dead, and his estate rendered in-12 solvent, and in that case his executor or administrator

13 may be summoned to answer thereto, and judgment 14 rendered as in other cases against executors and ad-15 ministrators, and execution issued and enforced to sat-16 isfy such lien.

SECT. 2. This act is in force when approved.
