The Committee on Military Affairs, to which was referred an order of the Legislature authorizing them to visit the Soldiers' Orphans' Home at Bath, have attended to that duty, and ask leave to

REPORT:

That an appropriation be made of one thousand dollars to be expended in fitting up a convenient place for washing and laundry purposes, a suitable room for washing and bathing, and for an increase in the facilities for cooking, which at present are wholly inadequate.

A further appropriation of one thousand dollars to be expended in paying for a lot of land adjoining the Home, which has become a necessity, and for which the Trustees have bargained.

A further appropriation of seven thousand dollars to be expended in meeting the ordinary expenses of the Home.

And your Committee unanimously recommend the accompanying Resolve.
