STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in relation to our ship-building and mercantile interests.

Resolved, That our senators in congress be instructed, 2 and our representatives requested, to press upon the 3 immediate attention of that body, the passage of an 4 act allowing to the builder of any ship, vessel or 5 steamer, a drawback equal to the duty paid upon all 6 the articles entering into the construction of said ship, 7 vessel or steamer; and that all provisions and supplies 8 necessary for repairs or equipment of said vessels or 9 steamers may be taken out of bond, under the regula- 10 tions of the treasury.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to com- 2 municate a copy of these resolves to our senators and 3 representatives in congress.
