STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and eighteen, section six, of the revised statutes, relative to the penalty for placing obstructions on railroads.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That chapter one hundred and eighteen, section six, 2 of the revised statutes, be amended in the second line 3 by inserting after the words "any part of," the 4 words, 'an engine, car, signal;' and in the sixth line 5 by changing the word "second" to 'first'; and in the 6 eighth line, by changing the word "thirty" to 'sixty,' 7 and in the ninth line after the words "hard labor," 8 so change as to read, 'during life or for a term of 9 years,' so that said section when amended Shall read 10 as follows:

HOUSE-No. 10.

11 Sect. 6. Whoever willfully and maliciously displaces 12 a switch or rail, disturbs, injures or destroys any parf 13 of an engine, car, signal, track or bridge of any rail 14 road, or places any obstruction thereon, with intent 15 that any person or property passing on the same 16 should be thereby injured, and human life is thereby 17 destroyed, shall be deemed guilty of murder of the 18 first degree and punished accordingly. If human 19 life is thereby endangered and not destroyed, or prop-20 erty is injured, he shall be punished by solitary con-21 finement not less than sixty days, and afterwards by 22 imprisonment and hard labor during life, or for a 23 period of not less than ten years.
