STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT amending chapters fifty-one and fifty-two of the revised statutes, relating to railroads and steam navigation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section thirty-six, chapter fifty-one, of
- 2 the revised statutes, is hereby amended so as to read
- 3 as follows:
- 4 Sect. 36. Any railroad corporation, by whose negli-
- 5 gence or carelessness, or by that of its servants or
- 6 agents while employed in its business, the life of any
- 7 person who would have a legal right to recover dam-
- 8 ages in case of mere injury from accident, in the
- 9 exercise of due care and diligence, is lost, shall forfett
- 10 not less than five hundred nor more than five thousand

- 11 dollars to be recovered in the county where the injury
- 12 occurs, by indictment, or in an action of debt, if said
- 13 indictment or action is brought within two years after
- 14 such death, wholly to the use of the widow, if no
- 15 children, and to the children, if no widow, if both, to
- 16 her and them equally; if neither, for the benefit of
- 17 the estate.
 - SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to any pending
 - 2 indictment or cause of action which may have accrued
 - 3 more than one year prior to the passage of this act.
 - Sect. 3. Section seven of chapter fifty-two of the
 - 2 revised statutes, is hereby so amended that the remedy
 - 3 shall be the same as is provided in the preceding sec-
 - 4 tion of this act.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
