STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to disturbing public meetings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Whoever wilfully and unlawfully disturbs or inter-
2 rupts any assembly of persons lawfully assembled in
3 any hall or other place of meeting, shall be punished
4 by imprisonment not more than thirty days, or by fine
5 not exceeding ten dollars, or both, in the discretion of
6 the court.
