IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to disturbing public meetings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whoever wilfully and unlawfully disturbs or inter-

- 2 rupts any assembly of persons lawfully assembled in
- 3 any hall or other place of meeting, shall be punished
- 4 by imprisonment not more than thirty days, or by fine
- 5 not exceeding ten dollars, or both, in the discretion of
- 6 the court.
