IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes, relating to bowling alleys and billiard rooms.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised  
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out all after the  
3 word "recovered" in the third line and inserting the  
4 following, 'on complaint or indictment to the use of  
5 the person prosecuting,' so that said section as amended  
6 shall read as follows :

7 *Sect. 3.* No person shall keep a bowling alley or  
8 billiard room without a license, under a penalty of ten  
9 dollars for each day such alley or room shall be so  
10 kept, to be recovered upon complaint before a judge

11 of a municipal or police court, or trial justice, or by  
12 indictment, to the use of the person prosecuting.
