IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes, relating to bowling alleys and billiard rooms.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised
- 2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out all after the
- 3 word "recovered" in the third line and inserting the
- 4 following, 'on complaint or indictment to the use of
- 5 the person prosecuting,' so that said section as amended
- 6 shall read as follows:
- No person shall keep a bowling alley or Sect. 3.
- 8 billiard room without a license, under a penalty of ten
- 9 dollars for each day such alley or room shall be so
- 10 kept, to be recovered upon complaint before a judge

- 11 of a municipal or police court, or trial justice, or by
- 12 indictment, to the use of the person prosecuting.
