IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-six of chapter one hundred thirteen of the revised statutes, relating to poor debtors' disclosures.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section twenty-six of chapter one hundred thirteen of the revised statutes, shall be so amended as to read as follows : A debtor who has given such bond may within the time limited therein give notice to the creditor or creditors of his intention to submit himself to examination and take the oath prescribed in section thirty ; or if he is committed or has delivered himself into the custody of the jailor, he, or the jailor in his behalf may give such notice, and

29 you are hereby notified that you may select one of the
30 justices and object if you see fit. Dated at —,

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
