STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT explanatory of section eighty-three of chapter eighty-one of the revised statutes, relating to actions on promissory notes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. When a promissory note is attested by a
- 2 subscribing witness at the time of its execution, in the
- 3 presence of the maker, it shall be sufficient evidence
- 4 of its due attestation, without further proof that it was
- 5 done at his request; and proof of the signature of a
- 6 subscribing witness who has deceased or removed from
- 7 the jurisdiction of the court, shall be prima facie
- 8 evidence of said attestation.
 - SECT. 2. This act shall not affect any pending cases.
