STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to authorize cities and towns to hold money in trust for certain useful purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any city or town is authorized to re-2 ceive money, by donation or legacy, on trust for 3 benevolent, religious or educational purposes; *provided*, 4 that the city or town in its appropriate mode of legal 5 procedure shall give its consent.

SECT. 2. Interest shall be allowed if the fund shall 2 be used by the city or town; otherwise it shall be 3 placed at interest or income, the city or town being 4 hereby made responsible for its security.

SECT. 3. The city or town, by its officers or agents, 2 shall apply the fund or its income in accordance with

3 the written directions of the donor or testator, made4 known at the time the fund was accepted.

SECT. 4. If the city or town shall fail to apply the 2 fund or its incomes, at the times and for the purposes 3 prescribed in said directions, it shall revert to the 4 donor, if living; if deceased, to his heirs.
