STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to provide for the better supervision of common schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Every town shall annually elect by
- 2 ballot a supervisor of schools, and his election shall
- 3 terminate the office of any and all existing members
- 4 of school committees previously elected.
 - SECT. 2. The state superintendent and town super-
- 2 visors shall constitute a board of education, of which
- 3 the state superintendent shall be ex officio secretary.
 - SECT. 3. Aside from the duties already imposed by
- 2 law, town supervisors shall annually hold, during the
- 3 months of May and November, town institutes, the
- 4 duration of which shall not exceed two days, with the

- 5 view of disseminating the best methods of instructing
- 6 and governing schools, and for the examination of
- 7 teachers, of which suitable notice shall be given to
- 8 teachers and all persons proposing to be such.
 - SECT. 4. There shall annually be held by the state
- 2 superintendent or some suitable person designated by
- 3 him in each county, a supervisors' and teachers' insti-
- 4 tute to continue at least three days, due notice of
- 5 which shall be given to supervisors whose duty it shall
- 6 be to attend; and an invitation extended to teachers,
- 7 and persons desiring to teach, to be present.
 - Sect. 5. To defray the expenses of these institutes
- 2 three thousand dollars shall annually be appropriated,
- 3 to be expended by the state superintendent, who shall
- 4 render an account thereof to the governor and council,
- 5 to be examined and audited by them
- SECT. 6. Sections eighty-one and eighty-two of
- 2 chapter eleven of the revised statutes are hereby re-
- 3 pealed.
