STATE OF MAINE.

AN ACT in addition to chapter twenty-six of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representativ in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-nine of chapter twenty-

- 2 six of the revised statutes is amended so as to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 Sect. 29. Whenever any building or vessel in port
- 5 or their contents are wholly or partially destroyed by
- 6 fire, it shall be the duty of the mayor of the city or
- 7 the municipal authorities of the town or plantation
- 8 where the fire occurs, to give notice thereof at once to
- 9 the sheriff of the county or his deputy; and said
- 10 sheriff or deputy shall thereupon immediately summon
- 11 six good and lawful men to appear at the place of the
- 12 fire at a time to be fixed as soon as possible to inquire
- 13 when, how and by what means the fire originated;

- 14 and in case of the non-appearance of any person so
- 15 summoned, the officer shall appoint some other person
- 16 to complete said number, and it shall be the duty of
- 17 all persons so summoned to appear and act under such
- 18 summons unless excused for reasonable cause.
 - SECT. 2. Sections thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two and
 - 2 thirty-three of said chapter are amended by substitut-
 - 3 ing the words "sheriff or deputy" in the place of
 - 4 "judge or justice," wherever those words occur
 - 5 therein.
 - Sect. 3. The fees of the officer and jurors for such
 - 2 service, shall be the same as prescribed for the coroner
 - 3 and jurors in cases of inquest upon dead bodies.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
