
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to define what shall constitute pauper supplies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. That to constitute pauper supplies under
2 the laws of this state such supplies shall be applied
3 for in case of all adult persons of sound mind by such
4 persons themselves or by some person by them duly
5 authorized ; or such supplies shall be received by such
6 persons or by some person duly authorized by them
7 with a full knowledge that they are such supplies.
8 And all care, whether medical or otherwise, furnished
9 said persons shall be subject to same rule.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
