STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend the second specification of section fifty-four of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, in regard to studies taught in common schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The second specification of section fifty-four of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

4 *Second*—On satisfactory evidence that a candidate
5 possesses a good moral character, and a temper and
6 disposition suitable to be an instructor of youth, they
7 shall examine him in reading, spelling, English gram-
8 mar, geography, history, arithmetic, book-keeping,
9 and physiology, and such other branches as they may

10 desire to introduce into public schools, and particularly
11 in the school for which he is examined, and also as to
12 capacity for the government thereof.
