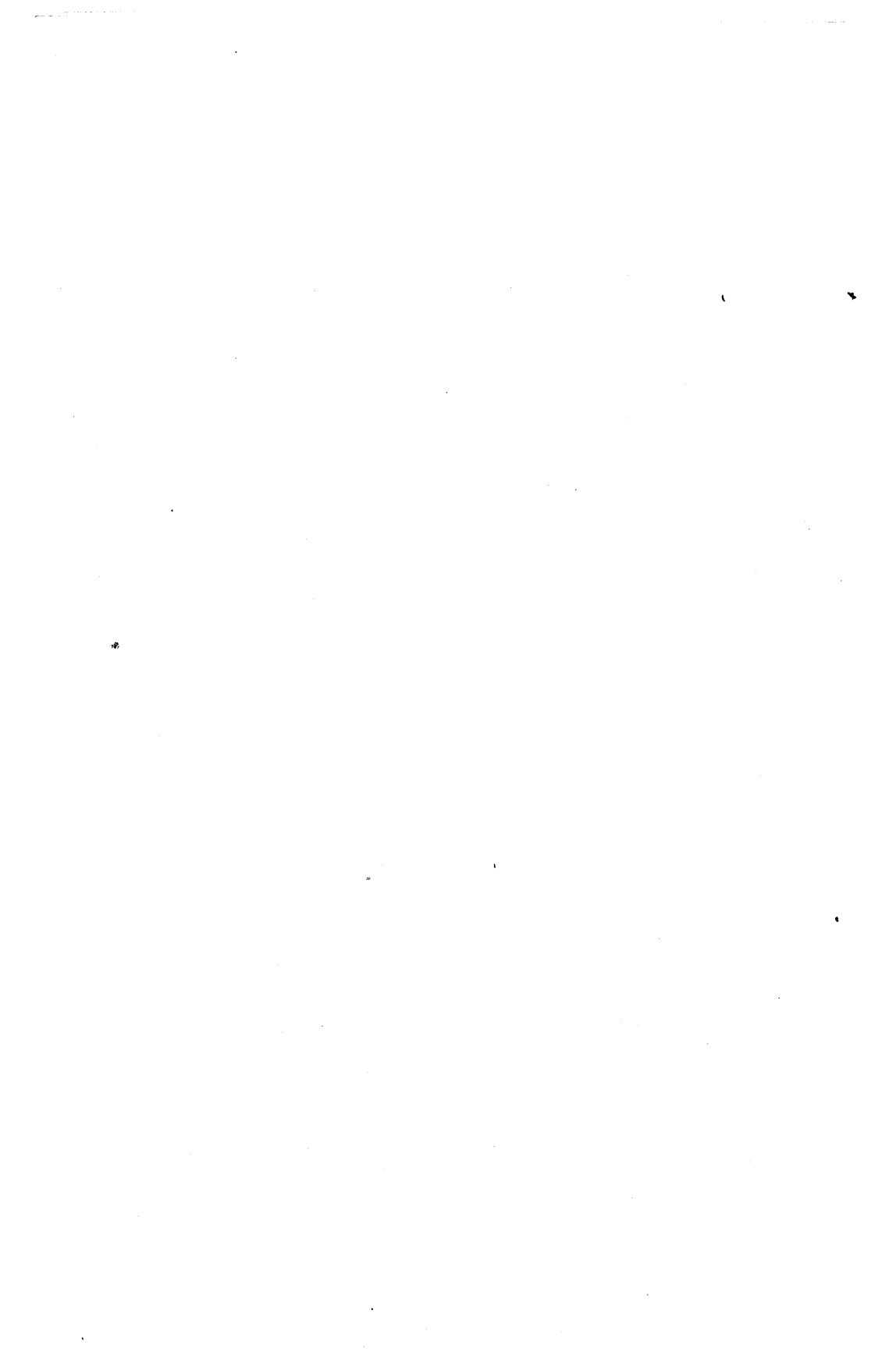
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ACT concerning paupers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Whenever any town is obliged to furnish
2 relief to persons having no legal settlement in this
3 state, the cost of the same supplies or relief shall be
4 reimbursed to said town by the county in which such
5 town is situated, the county commissioners of such
6 county determining what amount has been judiciously
7 expended therefor.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
2 this act are hereby repealed.
