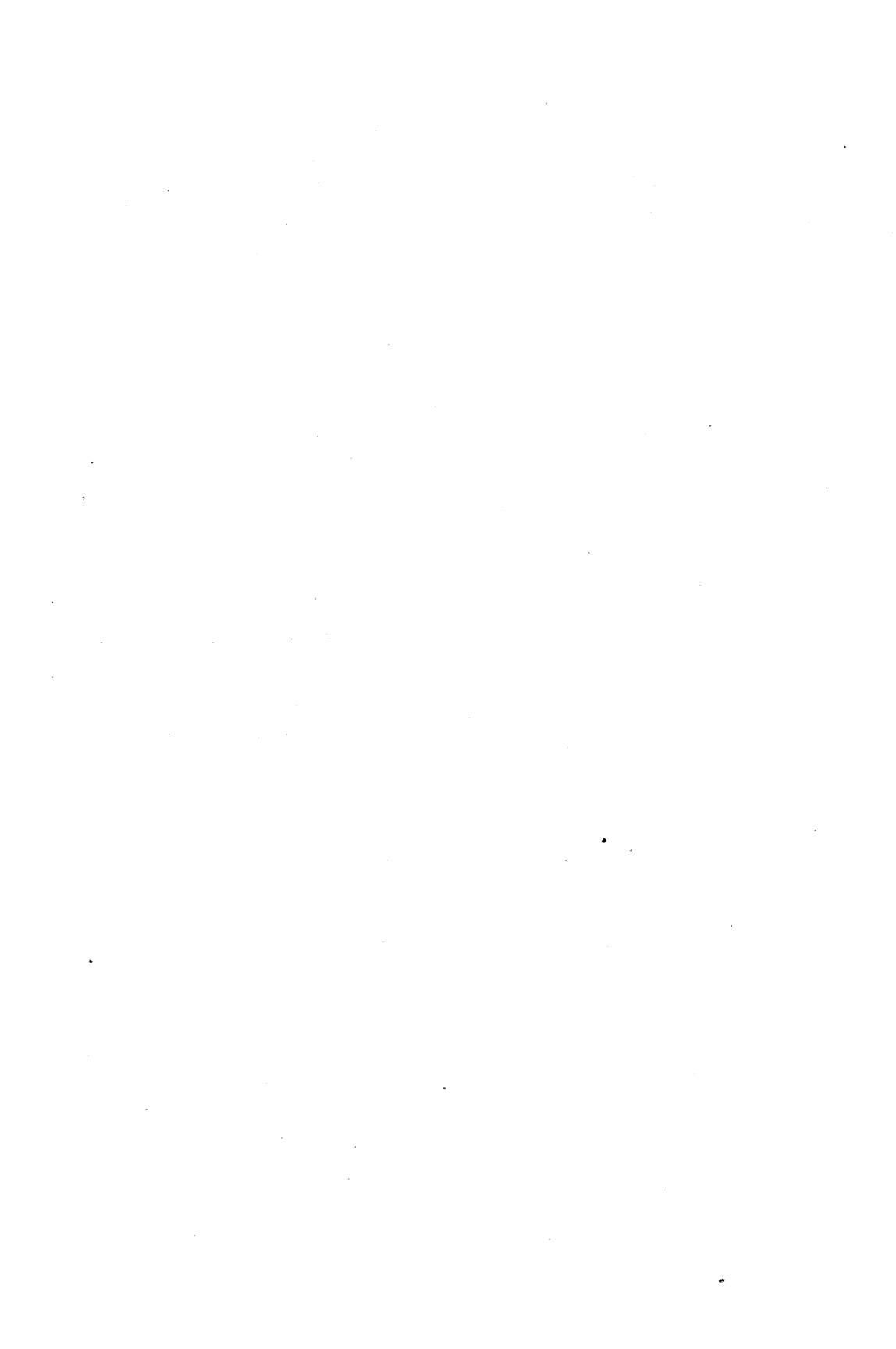
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to amend section five, chapter thirty, revised statutes, relating to wolves and bears.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section five, chapter thirty, revised statutes, is hereby amended by striking out the word "and," and inserting after the word "bear," and before the word "killed," in line first, of said section five, so that said section, as amended, shall read: A bounty of five dollars for every wolf, bear, loup-cervier, and wild cat, and two dollars for every red fox, killed in any town in this state, shall be paid by the treasurer thereof to the person killing it, on his complying with the following provisions.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
