STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT additional to chapter twenty-seven of the revised statutes, relating to inn-holders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Inn-holders shall not be liable for losses
- 2 sustained by their guests, except wearing apparel,
- 3 articles worn or carried upon the person, to a reasonable
- 4 amount, personal baggage, and money necessary for
- 5 travelling expenses and personal use, unless upon
- 6 delivery or offer of delivery, by such guests, of their
- 7 money, jewelry, or other property, to the inn-holder,
- 8 his agent or servants, for safe custody.
- SECT. 2. In case of loss by fire or any overwhelm-
- 2 ing force, inn-holders shall be answerable to their

- 3 guests only for ordinary and reasonable care in the
- 4 custody of their baggage or other property.
 - SECT. 3. An inn-holder against whom a claim is
- 2 made for loss sustained by a guest, may in all cases,
- 3 show that such loss is attributable to the negligence of
- 4 the guest himself, or to his non-compliance with the
- 5 regulations of the inn; provided, such regulations are
- 6 reasonable and proper, and are shown to have been
- 7 brought to the notice of the guest.
