## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to amend section five, chapter one hundred and eleven of the revised statutes, relating to recording conditional notes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section five of chapter one hundred and eleven of the 2 revised statutes, is hereby amended, by adding after 3 the word "dollars," in the fifth line, the following: 4 "except as between the original parties to said agree-5 ment," so that said section, as amended, shall read as 6 follows:

7 Sect. 5. No agreement that personal property bar-8 gained and delivered to another, for which a note is 9 given, shall remain the property of the payee, till the 10 note is paid, is valid, unless it is made and signed as

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11 a part of the note; nor when it is so made and signed 12 in a note for more than thirty dollars, except as be-13 tween the original parties to said agreement, unless it 14 is recorded like mortgages of personal property; and 15 on receipt of twenty-five cents, each town clerk shall 16 record such notes in a book kept for that purpose.
