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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

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AN ACT to amend section five, chapter one hundred and eleven of the revised statutes, relating to recording conditional notes.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section five of chapter one hundred and eleven of the 2 revised statutes, is hereby amended, by adding after 3 the word "dollars," in the fifth line, the following : 4 "except as between the original parties to said agree- 5 ment," so that said section, as amended, shall read as 6 follows :

7 *Sect. 5.* No agreement that personal property bar- 8 gained and delivered to another, for which a note is 9 given, shall remain the property of the payee, till the 10 note is paid, is valid, unless it is made and signed as

11 a part of the note ; nor when it is so made and signed  
12 in a note for more than thirty dollars, except as be-  
13 tween the original parties to said agreement, unless it  
14 is recorded like mortgages of personal property ; and  
15 on receipt of twenty-five cents, each town clerk shall  
16 record such notes in a book kept for that purpose.
