## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to better protect sheep husbandry from destruction by dogs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Any person or persons, having reasons
- 2 to believe that they have had sheep or lambs killed or
- 3 injured by dogs, can appeal to any justice of the
- 4 peace or trial justice, in town where such damage is
- 5 done, and demand an investigation of the matter, to
- 6 commence within twelve hours after notice is given, at
- 7 the place specified by complainant, to see if said dam-
- 8 age was done by dogs or otherwise.
  - SECT. 2. If said justice of the peace or trial justice,
- 2 after a hearing from parties injured, and summoning
- 3 not more than three persons to act as investigating

- 4 committee and appraisers, shall conclude that said
- 5 damage was done by dogs, he shall proceed to ascer-
- 6 tain whose dog it was that did the injury, when the
- 7 said appraisers will fix said damage, to be paid to-
- 8 gether with the necessary expenses of investigation,
- 9 by the person accused.
  - SECT. 3. In case such investigation should fail to
- 2 identify the dog or dogs, and affix the ownership of
- 3 the same, the complainant with a certificate from said
- 4 justice and appraisers shall receive his full damage
- 5 and expenses of said investigation, from the state
- 6 treasurer.
  - SECT. 4. When the investigation shall fail to prove
- 2 that the damage was done by dogs, the complainant
- 3 shall pay the expenses.
  - SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
