STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT amendatory of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sections fifty-two, fifty-three and fifty-four of chapter 2 thirty-eight of the revised statutes are hereby amend-3 ed so as to read as follows:

4 Sect. 52. All hay pressed and put up in bundles shall 5 have written, printed or stamped on bands or boards 6 made fast to the same, the first letter of the christian and 7 the whole of the sirname of the person putting up the 8 same, and with the name of the state and the place 9 where such person lives. And any person offering for 10 sale or shipment any pressed hay not marked as afore-11 said shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars for each

12 bale so offered, to be recovered by complaint before13 any court of competent jurisdiction.

14 Sect. 53. No sworn weigher of hay shall purchase15 more hay than is necessary for his own use.

15 Sect. 54. If the master of any vessel takes on board
17 pressed hay not marked as aforesaid, he shall forfeit
18 ten dollars for each bundle so received, to be recovered
19 as in section fifty-two.
