## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to authorize clerks of the supreme judicial courts to appoint deputies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any clerk of the supreme judicial court 2 may appoint a deputy who shall be authorized to per-3 form all the duties of such officer when by reason of 4 sickness or other unavoidable cause he is unable to per-5 form the duties of his office; and said deputy shall 6 be paid for his services out of the salary of the clerk; 7 and said clerk shall be responsible for all acts of his 8 deputy performed in the discharge of his official duties.

SECT. 2. Before entering upon the discharge of his 2 official duties, said deputy shall be sworn and give 3 bond to the clerk, approved by the county commis-

4 sioners of the county and lodged in the office of the 5 county treasurer, in the sum of eight thousand dollars, 6 with two or more sureties conditioned that he will 7 faithfully perform all the duties of his office as the 8 statutes relating to clerks of courts now provide.

SECT. 3. Said deputy shall have all the powers and 2 perform all the duties as the clerk, and be subject to 3 the same penalties for any neglect of duty as set forth 4 and provided by the law regulating the duties of clerks.
