STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to further protect fish in the interior waters of
the state.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No person shall catch, take or kill any
2 land-locked salmon, togue, or trout, in any of the
3 waters of the state of Maine by means of any grapnel,
4 spear, trawl, weir, net or seine, or in any other way
5 than by line and hook or fly.

SECT. 2. The penalties provided in chapter forty of
2 the revised statutes for illegal fishing shall apply to all
3 violations of this act.
