AMENDMENT B

To Bill An Act to continue in force chapter ninety-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three, providing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen.

[House Doc. No. 35.]

AMENDMENT "B."

Amend the bill as printed [House Doc. 35] in the
2 fifth and sixth lines, by striking out the words, " who
3 are partially or totally disabled by accident or chronic
4 sickness," and inserting the words, ' who are totally
5 disabled by chronic lameness, chronic sickness, or
6 mental imbecility,' so that said section two will read
7 as follows :

8 *Sect. 2.* The widow during her widowhood, orphan
9 children under twelve years of age, orphan minor chil-
10 dren over twelve years of age, who are totally disa-
11 bled by chronic lameness, chronic sickness, or mental
12 imbecility, or the dependent parent or sister of any
13 soldier or seamen, deceased from wounds or injury

14 sustained in the service while in the line of duty, are
15 entitled to the same pension as provided in section one
16 and under similar conditions. *Provided*, that no more
17 than eight dollars per month be paid to one family.
