STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-FOUR.

AN ACT relating to the commitment of certain classes to
the reform school.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No judge of any court, or trial justice,
2 shall hereafter sentence to the reform school, any boy
3 between the ages of eight and sixteen years, convicted
4 of vagrancy, truancy, or of being a common runaway
5 or night-walker.

SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of the trustees of said
2 reform school to discharge therefrom all boys commit-
3 ted to school for idleness, for vagrancy, for truancy,
4 or for being a common runaway or night-walker.

SECT. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
2 the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.
