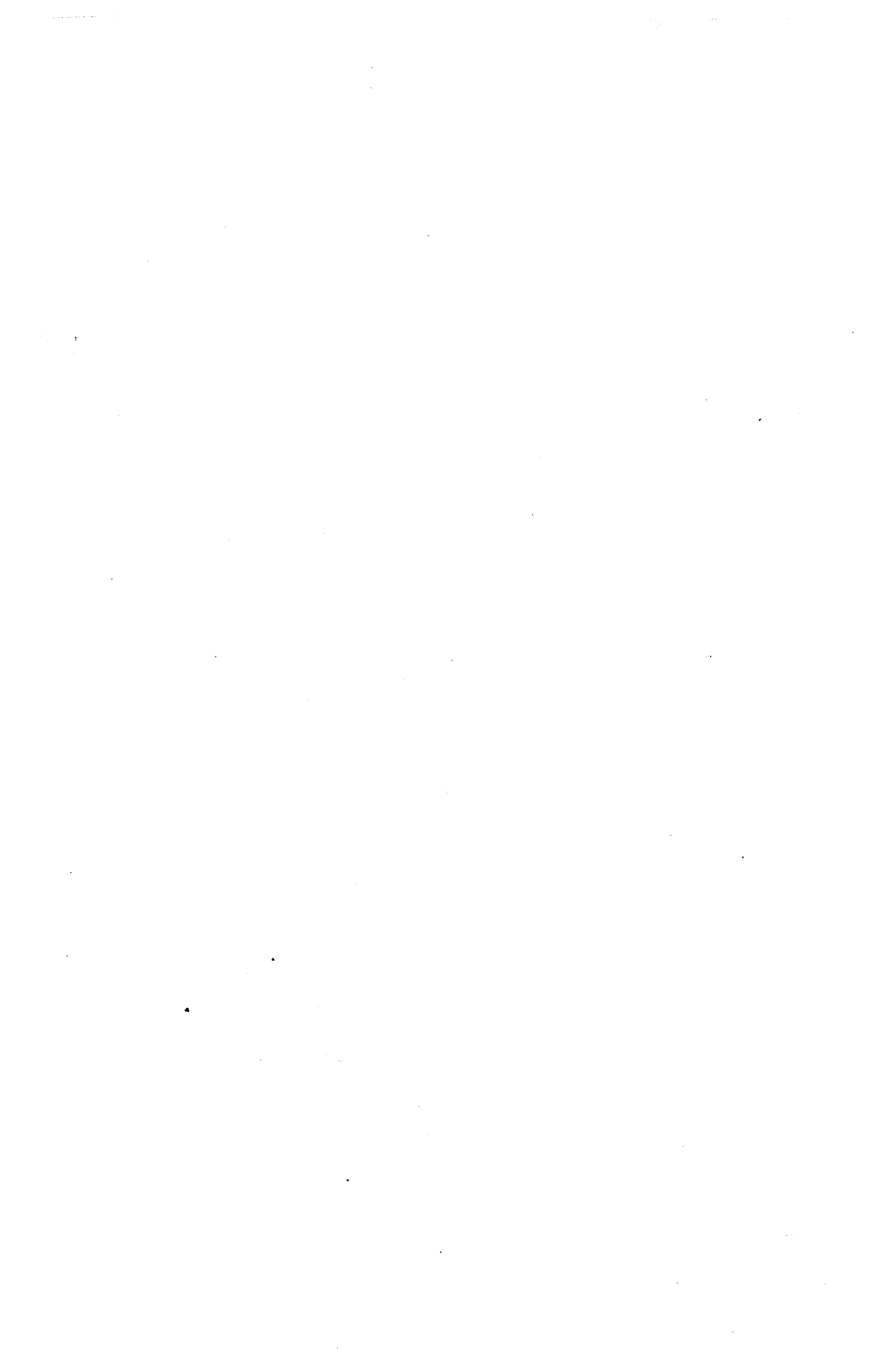
STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT for the protection of owners of stolen bonds.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

No action shall be commenced or maintained upon
2 any stolen bonds or coupons unless commenced within
3 six months after the cause of action accrues ; *provided*
4 *only* that in case of stolen bonds or coupons now out-
5 standing and overdue, no action shall be maintained
6 unless commenced within six months from the passage
7 of this act.
