STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to prevent fraud in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Promissory notes, bills of exchange, or
- 2 any other negotiable instruments, hereafter made and
- 3 fraudulently obtained from the maker, acceptor or
- 4 signer thereof, where the consideration in whole or in
- 5 part consists of the right to make, use, or vend agri-
- 6 cultural implements patented or claimed to be patented,
- 7 including also those given in whole or in part for such
- 8 implements, or given in whole or in part under any
- 9 contract concerning such implements, either relating
- 10 to an agency to sell such implements or otherwise,
- 11 shall, in any suit in any court by any indorsee or
- 12 holder of the same, be subject to the defence of fraud
- 13 or failure of consideration to the extent of the consid-

14 eration included in such note, bill of exchange, or 15 other negotiable instrument, for such implements, or 16 the right to make, use or vend them, or any contract 17 concerning them; but this act shall not apply where 18 such implements are sold or contract made in any store 19 by the occupant in the course of his business as a 20 trader, nor where both parties to such sale or contract 21 have resided in the same county for one year, nor 22 where the entire amount of such sale or contract is

23 less than fifty dollars.
