STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter twenty-seven of the revised statutes, relating to intoxicating liquors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall knowingly bring into 2 this state, or knowingly transport from place to place 3 in this state, any intoxicating liquors with intent to 4 sell the same in this state in violation of law, or with 5 intent that the same shall be so sold by any person, or 6 to aid any person in such sale, under a penalty or fine 7 of fifty dollars for each offence.

SECT. 2. All such intoxicating liquors intended for 2 unlawful sale in this State may be seized while in 3 transit, and proceeded against the same as if they 4 were unlawfully kept and deposited in any place.
